




Luttrellstown Castle Venue Guide

(Simple Tips To Benefit Your Wedding Photos)

Create the ideal location for hair/makeup by making sure you are situated facing a natural source of light. The Master Bathroom is the ideal location with plenty of light, space, and contains the mess to the bathroom.



Try to get into your dress with enough time for your photographer to leave for the ceremony 30 mins ahead of you.



Have the following ready to photograph: Dress, shoes, flowers, invitations, rings, any other pieces such as jewellery, or perfume.



Put on your dress near the big windows of the suite. Always angle yourself towards the light. These spots work best in the master bedroom. Be sure to have these areas clear of clutter and door to the bathroom shut for photos.

Bridal Prep Photo Tips

(The Master Bedroom)

There are two really great options for the groom prep photos. The Library and the Guinness Suite. Both are located downstairs in the castle.

Guinness Suite

The Guinness Suite will compliment the colour palette of the rest of the castle in photos. It's a great option for smaller groups or the groom on his own.



The Library offers a contrasting look to the bridal prep portraits. It's also a bigger room which is best for bigger groups.




Other Spaces For Morning Prep (Possible Rooms for Groom Prep)



I always consider the light first and backdrop second when choosing a ceremony space.

My favourite room in the castle is the room attached to the bar. The light is very flattering from the side windows.

This spot will offer the best light on a sunny day. It's a cracker of a location for an alternative outdoor ceremony space and will offer the most flattering light of all the outdoor locations.



The main entrance hall is another option for an indoor ceremony. It is better for larger groups but keep in mind there is less window light here and will have a more dramatic affect on your photos.



The most popular spot outside is at the back of the castle. This spot is ideal as the sun will be more direct to your front or back creating less harsh shadows.

The front lawn offers a unique backdrop with the archway in the bushes but there will be more chance of shadows here if it is very sunny.



On-site Ceremonies (Best Locations and Positioning)



Always fill the centre of the reception room with tables first and work out from there.

Avoid leaving a gap in the middle of the room as your reception room photos will be more evenly balanced this way.

Rain on your wedding day? Try the Library or the drawing room just next to the Library. Both are good options for group or bridal portraits. The main entrance hall, bar, and outside entrance to the castle are also great alternatives.



These types of spots make a better cake backdrop than against the windows. Always try to avoid placing important details in front of a window. Instead opt for the light to be head on or from the side. You can also opt for having the cake in the centre of the room as a focal point.
